As your Member of Congress, my staff and I are available to assist constituents of New York's Third Congressional District in dealing with federal agencies.

What is a Casework Request?

In order to provide better service and be more accessible to my constituents, I have a district office located in Hauppauge. This office is where I am able to assist constituents with what we call **casework requests**. These are individual requests made by constituents for assistance with a federal agency. Typical requests for casework involve lost documents or slow moving processes.

How can I help?

Although I am unable to assure a specific outcome regarding a particular case, I may make inquiries as to the status of your case, obtain additional information, or direct you to appropriate resources or services. My role is to assure you a fair and thorough review of your case and to seek a timely response from the agency.

Here are a few questions to help you determine if I can assist in your case:

Does your case involve a Federal Agency?

As a Member of Congress, I am only able to make inquiries of Federal agencies (link to Federal Agency Resources under Services). My staff and I will try our best to help you in any way that we can. If you believe your case involves a state, county or local government or other public agencies please contact your elected official. For your convenience, a list of many state, local and community based agencies are made available here (link to government resources).

Does your case involve a legal dispute?

As a member of the Legislative Branch, I am unable to become involved with legal matters due to the Separation of Powers as outlined in the U.S. Constitution.

How can you get started?

In order to expedite your case, kindly fill out the [Privacy Release Form](#) below. Once this form has been received, my staff will follow-up with you shortly. It may be necessary to set-up an appointment in order to meet with staff so that you can provide us with copies of relevant documentation.
